## Have you #gotthebottle? Matlock has!

In June Matlock Town Council declared a Climate and Ecological emergency. One of the Council's first actions in response was to become a Local Champion for the award-winning Refill Scheme which has been rolled out in the town over the Summer.

The Refill Scheme was launched in 2015 by City to Sea, a not-for-profit organisation, the aim of it being to reduce the amount of single-use plastic people use. The Scheme works by encouraging local businesses such as cafes and bars to become Refill Stations- they sign up to the free Refill app and put a sticker in their window which tells people they can fill their reusable drinks bottle/container with fresh tap water for free.

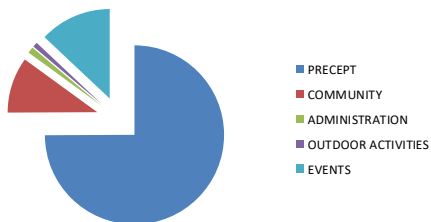
Local Champion, Councillor Paul Cruise, said, "This is a great community-based way to reduce our environmental impact and help Matlock become an environmental beacon. I was really pleased with the response when I went to businesses and ask them to participate. Everyone was supportive and wanted to help in reducing our environmental impact. This is a small step that will make a big difference – make sure you sign up for the app and look out for the stickers in shop windows"

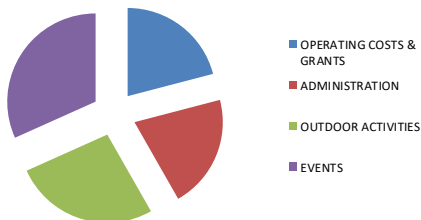

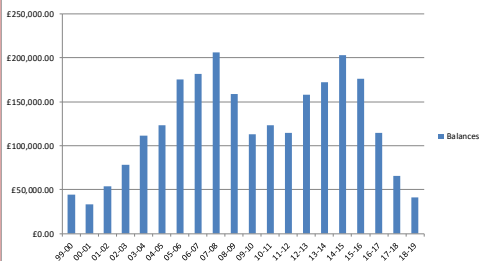

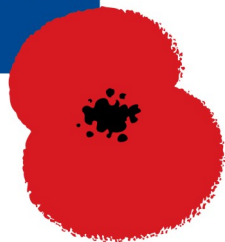
